IN MEMORIAM: ARMY SERGEANT DARREN PATRICK HUBBELL

We mourn the loss of a great man, and a great soldier. Sergeant Darren Patrick Hubbell was killed on June 20, 2007, when the vehicle he was riding in was hit by an IED. He was a great Soldier who served in Panama, Desert Storm, Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) I, III, and V. He will be missed, and never forgotten. His fellow soldiers will carry his memory with them for the rest of their lives.

Sgt Hubbell was a medic with the 1st Battalion, 64th Armor Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division from Fort Stewart, GA. Please read more about these dedicated soldiers on page 3 of this newsletter.

HELP FOR OUR WOUNDED WARRIORS

OTA has embarked on very a special project aimed at the troops who need our support the most – the Soldiers and Marines who have been injured in battle.

Our most recent efforts have been directed towards the 28th Division Combat Support Hospitals (CSH), whom we have provided dozens of boxes full of personal care items, Under Armor clothing, undergarments, socks, entertainment items, and travel bags to two of the 28th CSH's trauma hospitals located in Mosul and Baghdad. We also sent snacks and gifts for the fine nurses and doctors who work diligently every day to save the lives of these brave men and women.

When a soldier is injured in combat, these hospitals provide their first line of full medical care. As injuries can be extensive, patients spend just enough time to be stabilized and treated before they are transported to medical facilities outside Iraq. The patients usually have no personal items or clothing while at the hospital, nor do they have supplies to take with them once transported to other medical facilities. In most cases, uniforms are cut off leaving the patients with no other clothing than hospital gowns.

ARMY MEDICS OF THE 1-64 ARMOR THANK OTA

"I first contacted OTA in 2005 during the 1-64 Armor Battalion's deployment to Baghdad with a "wish list" for Under Armor socks and t-shirts for my group of medics. The troops were extremely grateful to OTA, but we all know, of course, this project would not have been possible without the donations from all of the great Americans that love to support the troops.

My team of medics are back in Iraq, and their mission is the same. This time, however, the zone is much more dangerous to my Soldiers of the 1-64 Armor. The medic's job this time has become even more paramount with the threat from the insurgents. The battalion is currently searching for the enemy, securing routes, providing security in the neighborhoods, and working and living with the Iraqi Army to ensure they are trained to ultimately provide a safe and secure Iraq. My medics provide the first line of medical care to the soldiers who are injured during these activities.

While we hope the day comes when our help is no longer needed, we will continue to support these brave men and women through our thoughts, prayers and these special gifts.

Now on our second deployment, OTA recently sent us another batch of moisture wicking Under Armor shirts, in addition to blankets, pillows, and sheets that provide them a sense of home and give the soldiers a comfortable place to rest their weary bodies after a long day of missions.

More importantly, OTA also sent a Camelbak M.U.L.E to each of the medics to utilize on their patrols or security missions. This piece of equipment has greatly enhanced the combat effectiveness of all the medics. Not only does it provide a critical hydration source, but the two pouches on the outer side hold the necessary Emergency Medical Equipment used to secure the airway and stop bleeding -- the two top causes of death on the battlefield.

The Soldiers were ecstatic when they received this equipment, as they knew how much it would help them help their Infantry and Armor Soldiers on the front line. None of this would be possible without the support of OTA's patrons, supporters, and volunteers. We would like to thank everyone that has donated to OTA so they could purchase all the items provided to our Medical Platoon. ABATE's next challenge was getting the items to the troops, and they turned to OTA for help. On April 7, 2007, a Shop 'N Save truck pulled up to the OTA storage facility in Shadyside, PA. Four pallets of razors, toothpaste, toothbrushes, foot care products, socks, deodorant and other personal care items were unloaded. It was a sight to behold!

And OTA had the perfect group to receive these items – the patients at two 28th Division Combat Support Hospitals in Mosul and Baghdad, Iraq (refer to *"Wounded Warrior"* article on p. 3).



This story reminds us that every project has a very big impact on those we help. The men and women of ABATE worked hard to raise the money and convert it to thousands of dollars worth of supplies. And without the generosity of Ray Charley and his suppliers, this project would have never been so successful.
